Rails to the Rocks Did Rock!





Minutes from the Board of Directors meeting on May 18, 2012 in Sioux Falls, SD

Present in a voting capacity were Gerry Miller, Paul Gerry, Paul Ullrich, Tracy McKibben, Jim Krekelberg and Jay Manning. Present in a non-voting capacity were Pete Magoun MMR (Central Division Director, NMRA); Dave Hamilton; Dennis Reitze; Mike Engler; Jim Bernier; Gerry Leone MMR; Alan Saatkamp; Jay Davis; Louis Seibel; and Frank Gerry.

The meeting was called to order by President Gerry Miller at 8:30 pm. A warm welcome to representatives from the NMRA national, Pete Magoun MMR, Central Division Director, and Gerry Leone MMR, Communications Director, and a quick around the table individual introductions started off the meeting.

The 2013 Convention Report for the Minneapolis Convention was made by Mike Engler since he had other obligations to fulfill that evening. The convention will be held at the Mall of America Best Western, which is adjacent the Mall of America and on the Minneapolis light rail system route. The convention will focus on modeling rather than prototype tours. There is at present no bus tour set up although a tour of the Progressive Rail facility is under negotiations as well as a complete schedule with possible guide for the light rail and Minnesota Northstar trips. On the modeling side there are currently 26 home layouts on tap for viewing on a self guided tour basis. The layouts may be open Friday, Saturday and Sunday for viewing. There are also 14-15 clinics spread over the convention as well.

The Secretary's report was made by Paul Gerry. A motion to accept the minutes of the St. Louis Park board of directors meeting as printed in the Fusee was made by Tracy McKibben and seconded by Jay Manning. The vote was unanimous in favour of the motion.

The Treasurer's report was make by Jim Krekelberg. One savings account was closed and converted to a CD to avoid service charges. The major expense was the matching grant made to the Twin Cities Division for the purchase of audiovisual equipment to aid in the delivery of clinics. \$150 was paid out in the Achievement Award bounty program. The DSED grant was actually more than the division needed for the trailer, and the excess funds were returned to the region. Overall the financial health of the region is still strong. A motion to accept the Treas-

urer's report was made by Paul Gerry and Seconded by Tracy McKibben. The vote was unanimous in favour of the motion.

The President's report was made by Gerry Miller. Overall the TLR is doing well both financially, in membership, and in involvement. The plea for additional judges has been answered but more are needed. It's a great way to find out exactly how the contest room operates and what it takes to make a contest ready or AP worthy model. More clinicians are needed to impart their wisdom to the rest of us. If anybody has an idea for a clinic or wants to present a clinic they are encouraged to come forward. Financially the region is well off and membership has been holding steady over the last year.

The Public Relations report was made by **Tracy McKibben.** The TLR Facebook's page is still up and running although not many people are posting to it. Anyone with interesting train or model related photos are encouraged to join and post.

The Achievement Program report was made by Dave Hamilton on behalf of John **Hotvet MMR who is attending his son's** wedding this weekend. Five AP certificates were awarded over the last six months. They were to Jeremy Dummler, Chief Dispatcher; Paul Ullrich, Association Official; Art Hill, Association Volunteer and Master Builder – Scenery; and Tracy McKibben, Model Railroad Author. Bob Gretillat also received a Golden Spike.

The Convention Chair report will be presented later by Jay Manning as part of the overall 2012 convention report.

Louis Seibel, a Midcontinent Region member and editor of the Caboose Kibitzer asked to speak. He reports that there will be an increased effort to promote the **TLR's events in the Kibitzer and the Midcontinent's events in The Fusee in an** effort to help out each individual regions attendance at said events. On that note, the Turkey Creek Division is having it annual Train Show July 14th in Overland Park, Kansas. The show will include model and photo contests, layout tours, a swap meet, and model railroad clinics.

The Prairie Lakes Division report was made by newly elected superintendent Jay Davis. The PLD had their annual meet in Mason City at the end of April. It was a great success with clinics, vendors and the group's modular layout on display. There were also two great home layout tours for the members as well as a chance to see "Lyon", a working replica of a Virginia and Truckee 2-6-0. Special thanks to the North Iowa Modular Club who helped coordinate the meet. The PLD's Fall meet will be held in Everly, Iowa on Sat, Oct 13 at the Hap Ketelson Community Center. The meet will feature vendors, operating layouts, clinics, layout tours and the spring business meeting.

The Number 1 Northern Division report was presented by Dennis Reitze. A meet was held back in November that was well attended with 1/3 of active members participating. After the meet, the division decided to form a Free-Mo Club (#1 Northern Free-mo Club) and the building of various Free-Mo modules has already started with the hopes that enough of them are finished for a show in the Fall. The Division also continues to work with the local Winnipeg Model Railroaders Club to manage a monthly model contest with a \$15 gift certificate for a local hobby shop being the prize.

The Minnesota River Valley report was presented by Paul Ullrich on behalf of Brian Wordes. The MRVD continues to have two scheduled meets a year for the membership and the work at the Montevideo Railroad museum layout continues. Operating sessions on some of the members' layouts have started as well. The Divisions newsletter, "The Waybill", continues to be published 3-4 times a year thanks to Curt and Jean Radunz.

The Dakota Southeastern Division report was presented by Alan Saatkamp. A very busy year by the division due to the planning and execution of this year's Convention and the use of the trailer provided for by the TLR grant to bring the clubs modular layout to various shows. The trailer had its modular loading racks made and installed by a DSED member, Eric Wollan. The trailer made its debut at the Ronning Library last September. The surplus of the grant money has been returned to the TLR and the trailer now resides at the Sioux Empire Fairgrounds when not in use. The support of the TLR in awarding the funding for the trailer is greatly appreciated. The sixth annual fall open house was a success but not at the level of previous years. The biggest public event was the Ronning Library open house with over 350 guests viewing the club layout as well as a portable N gauge layout, a Lionel O gauge layout, hands on diorama building activities, and switching cars on a portable HO layout. Membership is holding steady in the mid 20's. Superintendant Saatkamp will not seek re-election but will continue on as Fusee editor next year.

The Southeastern Division report was presented by Gerry Miller. The Division has started round robin building sessions on the members' layouts. The membership has been holding steady at around 15 people. Members of the division went to (continued on page 8)

Trainfest last year and are planning on helping with a charity train show this year.

The Twin Cities Division report was presented by Dave Hamilton on behalf of Ken Zieska. The division members continue to meet at the Jackson Street Roundhouse. The division continues its hands on clinics for its members and the public (who pay a fee), on various topics ranging from laser kit building, casting and staining mountains, weathering freight cars and how to incorporate scenic blocks in out layout design. These clinics have been greatly added with the addition of new audio/video equipment that allows the clinics to be projected onto an overhead screen for all to see. The purchase of the audio/visual equipment was made possible in part by a matching grant by the TLR that was approved last fall. The A/V equipment also allows the clinics to be taped and replayed later at future events. Future events are also in the works. The division's main task in the following year will be the planning of the upcoming 2013 Convention in Minneapolis.

The Historian's report was presented by Jim Bernier, our new Historian. All his-

torical documents have been forwarded from outgoing Historian Tom Mauszycki and are being kept in a climate controlled **room.** Next year's project will be to research how much it will be to start the digital scanning of this material.

The Fusee report was presented by Alan Saatkamp. Turnaround time at the printer is still a concern, but the final delivery date is still close to the promised one. The mass mailing of the spring issue continues to advertise the convention

and the electronic version will go out at the same time as the hard copy. Otherwise the electronic version will be released one issue behind the hard copy so that subscribers can have their copies before non-subscribers. There is a steady flow of pictures and articles, but divisions are asked to provide events so that they can be publicized. The Fusee continues as a selfsustaining entity due to subscribers, lower printing costs, and sold advertising.

The National report was made by Gerry Leone MMR. A new webmaster for the NMRA website has been named so the backlog of things to do should be sorted out over the next few months and new content to the **members' only section will be added** regularly which will include old issues

of Scale Rails/NMRA.ORG. Marketing director applications are being reviewed at this time. The Grand Rapids National Convention promises to be a great one with many layout tours and clinics to choose from. A new promotional Banner **measuring 7'-3' that can be customised for** each Region and individual division is in the works and currently features our very own Dennis Reitze.

OLD BUSINESS

A preliminary 2012 Convention report was made by Jay Manning. Overall the convention was a success with 102 registered participants. The overall number of women participating was down this year.

The DSED trailer grant as mentioned above was more than needed. Of the \$4500 in the grant, only about \$3900 was needed. The balance was returned to the TLR. The Twin Cites Audio/Visual grant was fully used and matched by the division in the purchase of the needed equipment. The equipment is being used at every meeting and members are learning its uses.

SPECIAL BUSINESS

Special guest Pete Magoun MMR, Central Division Director of the NMRA, filled in for Mike Brestel who couldn't make it. Pete was at the convention to represent the National Board members and be a target for questions, issues, and comments directed at the NMRA head office. Pete greatly enjoyed the convention and advised the DSED to work on the modular layout in public to attract interest. He is from Travers City, Michigan and attending he National Convention in Grand Rapids. He believes in the NMRA and wants to give back to an organization that has given him so much. Pete models a HO scale 1954 protofreelance layout as well as a HOn30 module.

NEW BUSINESS

The site for the 2014 Convention is still open, to be determined during the fall board meeting. Superintendants will be contacted to see if they can host. Anyone interested in hosting is encouraged to contact a board member.

Alan Saatkamp asked for guidance on when the electronic version should be released. It was decided to leave as is.

The TLR has new boundaries using County Lines instead of Zip Codes, affecting two people in Iowa. This is due to many local post offices shutting down. No word on Canadian boundary changes.

Discussion on continuing the Grant program resulted in a unanimous vote in favour. The Grant Program is being used for the Region's and hobby's betterment.

Secretary Paul Gerry requested and received approval to purchase a new transport case to house the notes/ minutes/reports.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made at 10:12pm by Tracy McKibben and was seconded by Paul Ullrich. The vote was unanimous in favour of the motion.

Minutes from the May 20, 2012 Thousand Lakes Region General Membership Meeting held in Sioux Falls, SD

Board members present were Paul Ullrich, Paul Gerry, Gerry Miller, Jim Krekelberg, Tracy McKibben, and Jay Manning. There were 32 members of the general membership present as well. The meeting was called to order at 9:01 am on May 20th, 2012 by President Gerry Miller.

The meeting started with reports from the board members, division heads and region officials concerning their respective areas of responsibility. Jay Manning added to the Convention Chairs report from the BOD meeting with the idea of putting together a "Lessons Learned" book for future Convention Chairs and a big Thank You to his team of DSED members and their support staff (i.e. wives) that made the convention the success that it was. Les Breuer MMR made a motion to accept the combined reports of the board, and Tom Ford seconded it. The motion passed unanimously. The minutes from the last board meeting held in St. Louis Park, MN last September was presented to the membership for approval. Duane Durr made a motion to approve the minutes as printed in the Fusee with Les Breuer MMR seconding it. The motion passed unanimously.

Next was a proposal to change the time of the General Membership Meeting to either an earlier time on Sunday or to either Saturday or Friday depending on what the convention schedule is. This would be so that layout tours could begin earlier than the traditional Noon start time. Alan Saatkamp made a motion to move up the General Membership Meeting to 8am from 9am on the Sunday of any given convention. Frank Gerry seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Next Les Breuer MMR made a motion to

thank Jay Manning and the DSED for a very fine convention. The motion was seconded by Gerry Leone MMR. The motion passed unanimously.

Dave Hamilton then presented the 2013 Convention report. The Convention to be held at the Best Western of Mall of America in Minneapolis, MN will have over 25 layouts on display and will concentrate on clinics rather than prototype activities although a few prototype tours are still in the works (i.e. Jackson Street Roundhouse and Friends of the 261 steam locomotive). There will also be operating sessions on various layouts to those who are interested.

Gerry Miller presented the 2014 Convention report which consisted of saying there was no specified location for this convention yet. Jay Manning will continue on as Convention Director and will be in contact with each division regarding locations for the 2014 convention.

Paul Gerry then presented for debate the concept that increased activities at conventions on Fridays made it harder for working members and members who wanted to bring children (kids or grandkids) to the convention as it requires taking the Thursday as well as the Friday off of work/school. Different solution which included two tiered registration for those who would make the Friday events and those who would not, pay as you go pricing for the activities and move everything to the Memorial Day weekend. The point that although recruiting younger new members is needed for the growth of the hobby, it is the "Baby Boomer" generation that attends most of these events and have the disposable income to spend on these events and they don't mind the all day Friday, Saturday, Sunday concept. Overall no agreement was reached at this time except to leave it in the hands of each convention chair to run their convention as they see fit.

Next was the election of board members. Jay Manning, Paul Ullrich, Tracy McKibben and Gerry Miller were up for re-election. No new candidates were presented or came forward at the meeting. A motion to nominate the members as presented was made by Alan Saatkamp and seconded by Fred Headon MMR. The motion passed unanimously. A motion to then cast a unanimous ballet in favour of the nominated was made by Duane Durr and was seconded by Frank Gerry. The motion passed unanimously. The newly re-elected members determined in caucus to continue on with their current positions. Jay, Paul, and Tracy were elected to two year terms with Gerry taking a one year term.

Louis Seibel then explained the upcoming Turkey Creek Annual Train Show and Regional Show occurring July 13-14, 2012 in Overland Park, Kansas.

Dennis Reitze then made a request on behalf of the Number 1 Northern for the board to consider the allowing of the new NMRA promotional banner to be purchased for the division. The division's next show is before the Fall BOD meeting, hence the early request. Gerry Miller made a request to the Board members that the TLR should purchase one of these banners (with Dennis Reitze on it by the way) for each division to help promote themselves and the NMRA. Paul Ullrich made the motion, and Jay Manning seconded it. The motion passed unanimously.
